- Designing, documenting and delivering the *BELFAST Programme* to help adult foreign nationals by:
 - Improving communication skills in English, so that Learners can get a job, a better job or promotion in the area where you have skills, qualifications and knowledge
 - Giving new opportunities to identify what Learners need to do to improve their English grammar and vocabulary for work and everyday living
 - Helping Learners understand the job-hunting process in Belfast and beyond.

The BELFAST Volunteers deliver the BELFAST Programme through:

- Beginner classes
- *Meetups*: Learners (normally B1 and above) meet regularly for English for Employability, apart from language guidance and support, they have opportunities to explore aspects of the job-hunting process in the local environment.
- *Personal Learning Plans*: Each individual has a monthly programme of work to guide and structure their private study
 - Self Access Centre: Resources are available for private study, including:
 - Grammar, vocabulary and dictionaries
 - Sector-specific language practice material
 - Material to provide skills practice at different levels from A1 to C2.

- 6 Carry out a review, normally every 4 weeks or online, of your progress with ideas, suggestions and recommendations for a revised Personal Learning Plan for the next month
- 7 ... and meet, talk to and network with like-minded people.
